HEP Mission Trip Update

The dates are in—from August 4 to August 9, a group of folks from St. Thomas à Becket Church will be taking a mission trip to the Highland Educational Project in McDowell County, West Virginia. So far we have about 9-10 people going, and there's room for up to about 10 or so more if you let us know soon! We are also letting folks from other parishes in the Deanery know about this opportunity to serve, learn, worship, and spend time with each other and the people of McDowell County.

This trip is for people 21 years old or older who are willing to go and help in whatever way they are able.

(In the future there could be youth or parent/teen trips as well.) We'll stay together in a former FEMA building with two dormitory rooms, a commercial kitchen, bathrooms, laundry facilities, and a large common room. There's a room set aside as a small chapel. We'll be sharing breakfast and dinners there, and in between we'll go into the community to work. HEP Director Paul Barker is helping us determine exactly what work we'll do, but it will likely include finishing construction or repair projects started by groups earlier in the summer and/or doing small jobs for local residents; helping service organizations such as a meals program, food bank, and clothing ministry; and planning and conducting a half-day reading event for local children and parents to be held at the HEP center. We expect to meet people who live and work in McDowell County and to learn more about the resources and needs there. In the evenings we'll have time to spend with each other.

In order to help HEP provide lodging, not only for our group in August but also for future groups from near and far, St. Thomas à Becket just donated \$1,000 for five bed frames and eight mattresses for the dormitory rooms. Bishop Matthew Cowden and Father Paul Barker hope to promote HEP as a destination for church summer mission trips at the General Convention—if their efforts bear fruit, HEP will need to be prepared!

If you are interested in going on the trip in August, please let Grace Ayscue know soon, and she'll connect you with the most up-to-date information about the trip. You can jump right in and help with planning. If you can't participate but want to support the trip, look for opportunities in the next couple of months!

St. Thomas à Becket will host the Marywood University Chamber Singers on Wednesday, May 22 for a free concert at 7:00 pm.



April Vestry Meeting Highlights

Jeff Fedan presented the report of the Property Committee. Lynda Waggoner is getting estimates on changes to the bathrooms. Rome wasn't built in a day; neither was the Rector's office but it is now finished. The vent in the kitchen has been installed and the process for refurbishing siding has begun. We are still figuring out whether a standard size door would fit in the entrance to the Sunday School room or if we need a custom made door.

Jeff also reported upon the great success of the cleanup day at the church. We had good attendance and got a lot done.

There was a field trip to view possible improvements

in the Memorial Garden. The ground under some of the bricks has settled, causing them to sink below the level of the rest of the bricks. One of the improvements would be to take up those bricks and fix what lies beneath. There would also be replacement of the latticework, some new landscaping, and enclosure of the heating and air conditioning unit. We may not proceed with this project immediately because the funding is uncertain.

The owner of Tireland has indicated that they might like to buy an acre of our land. Although there was no decision about doing that, we are going to investigate the possibility.

Jeff would like to have solar panels installed on our roof. We are going to investigate more.

A new Bible has been ordered for the sanctuary and should be here April 25.

After some investigation, it appears that the best spot for a nursing station is in the parlor. We are going to get whatever signs, equipment, etc. which may be necessary to establish a nursing station there.

Bernie Schultz reported on his investigation of the possibility of our sponsoring a summer reading camp. Reading Camp provides for elementary aged children (entering grades 2-4) an opportunity to help maintain their reading and literacy skills through the summer months. With the help of Susan Seitz, he found that there are several other organizations in Monongalia County doing such a camp. There is a possibility that we could join with a church in Kingwood to support something in Preston County but that would not be until the summer of 2025.

We divided sums available for the Amy Marshall Robbins scholarship between Sam Carver and Caleb Satterfield. Congratulations to both of them.

We are going to look into organizing foyer groups. This is a mechanism for encouraging small groups of congregants to meet for dinner. Jeff Fedan will follow up on this idea.
